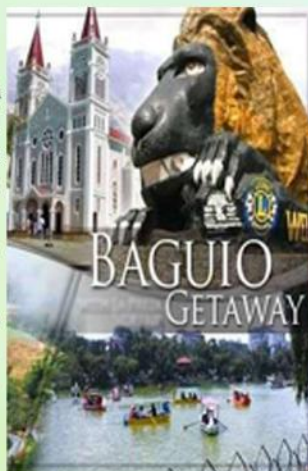


## About the place...

### BAGUIO CITY, PHILIPPINES

The name Baguio conjures, for both the international and domestic traveler, a highland retreat in the Grand Cordillera in Northern Luzon, with pine trees, crisp cold breeze and mountain ranges. It has made its mark as a premiere tourist destination in the Northern part of the Philippines with its cool climate, foggy hills, panoramic views and lovely flowers. Baguio is 8 degrees cooler on the average than any place in the lowlands. Baguio City is very wet during rainy season, which is from June to October. From November to May, Baguio becomes a tropical paradise, a refreshing break from hot and humid Philippine climate. Trip advisory: Baguio City is about a 5-6 hour bus ride north of Manila, and about 3-4 hour bus ride north of Pampanga Province. Baguio is much closer to other provinces such as La Union and Pangasinan.

## Format for the Extended Abstract

- Title (arial, 14 pt., bold, centered)
- Author's name (arial, 12 pt., bold, centered)
- Author's position, affiliation and full address (arial, 12 pt., centered, italicized)
- Author's telephone/fax number and e-mail address (arial, 12 pt., centered, italicized)
- Put an asterisk before the name of the author who will be presenting the paper.

The body of the abstract should be an explicit summary of the presentation and includes the introduction, objectives, brief methodology, major results and conclusions. It should be single-spaced in 12 pt. Arial. It should be up to 2-3 pages with a maximum of 600 words including 1 graph and/or table. Include the most significant figure and/or table related to the highlights presented in the abstract. It should also contain a complete caption describing the graph and/or table and placed above the table or below the figure.

**Keywords:** Provide a maximum of 5 keywords immediately after the abstract and must be italicized. Avoid general and plural terms and multiple concepts (avoid, for example, "and", "of"). Use abbreviations sparingly, specifically those that are firmly established in the field.

## Guidelines for Poster Making

A poster should be attractive, well-organized and self-explanatory. The discussion should give the interpretation and significance of the study. The poster should give one or two important conclusions.

The following points may help in planning/preparing the poster:

**Size.** Use a standard 30"x40" (76 cm x 103 cm) poster with the shorter edge at the top and bottom side with a portrait-orientation.

**Title.** The title should contain a maximum of 18 words. The title should be typed in capital letters, bold, using Times New Roman font, size 72 (minimum). Please do not use script type of fonts.

The full name and address/agency of the author(s) should be placed just below the title.

**Text.** Give a brief significance of the technology/information. Minimize words and maximize visuals in describing the technology. End with a brief conclusion (50 words). Preferably, the text should be typed using Times New Roman font, size 26 (minimum).

**Organization.** The design should flow sequentially from one part to the next. Numbers or letters may be used to facilitate the correct order: left to right or top to bottom. Do not clutter with too much text or artwork.
